I joined the Committee in 1995 and in November of that year became Honorary Secretary, a position I have been privileged to hold ever since. I am also the Society's representative on the Battle Abbey Explanatory Board (formerly the Battle Abbey Advisory Committee), a position I have held since 1999.

To mark the Golden Jubilee of the BDHS in 2000 I designed the '1066 Malfosse Walk' and its accompanying booklet, published by the BDHS, the purpose of which was to commemorate the Society's success in 1966 when members established the location of this often overlooked incident which occurred at the end of the Battle of Hastings.

In 2015 Keith Foord and I wrote '1066 and the Battle of Hastings: Preludes, Events and Postscripts', published by the BDHS to mark the 950th anniversary of the Battle of Hastings.

My historical interest is military (strategy and tactics), with particular emphasis on the events of 1066, the Cinque Ports, the Wars of the Roses, English Civil Wars and World War 1. I very much enjoy visiting battlefields and have conducted battlefield tours both in England and abroad.
